Key Points. Children can be infected with HIV through mother-to-child transmission, contaminated blood transfusions, unsterile medical equipment, or sexual abuse. A third of babies born to HIV-infected mothers will become infected. Children are most affected by HIV in settings where women are most affected by HIV.

How HIV and AIDS affect young children - Caring with ...

Aside from the physical and psychosocial stress associated with the onset of the disease itself and the experience of loss of loved ones, children affected by HIV/AIDS may additionally be subjected to the burden of caring for others, stigma, discrimination, exploitation, abuse, financial hardships, and are less likely to attend school.

THE TOLL ON CHILDREN. HIV and AIDS have exacted a terrible toll on children and their families. During the 30 years of the global HIV epidemic, an estimated 17 million children lost one or both parents due to AIDS. Ninety percent of these children live in sub-Saharan Africa. In addition, 3.4 million children under age 15 are living with HIV.
